A message from the General Manager, Deborah Burns



Our Foundation Treasurer, David DeMauro is retiring from the University after more than 22 years of service. He was hired in April 1986 as Director, Physical Plant (now Facilities Services). In July 1990 he was assigned to the position of Interim VP for Administration and Finance and appointed to VP for Admin and Finance in March 1991. In his role as Vice President, David provided guidance and oversight to the Foundation's management and, as the Foundation's Treasurer, worked closely with the Foundation Board of Directors.

For those that know David, it goes without saying that he leaves behind an extensive and impressive list of accomplishments. But he also leaves behind a long list of friends and many grateful students, colleagues and employees whom he has taken the time to coach and mentor during his tenure.

The Foundation Board, Staff and Employees are grateful for David's leadership, friendship and guidance over these many years and we extend our very best wishes for a happy, healthy and enjoyable retirement.

Advisory Committees Formed

The Foundation has formed Advisory Committees for both Dining Services and the Bookstore. The two committees are comprised of faculty, students and staff, along with representatives from the dining or bookstore operations. The Advisory Committee Meetings will provide a forum where concerns, new ideas, policies and procedures can be discussed to promote better services. The meetings will be held quarterly with the first meetings scheduled for the week of January 26th.

Upward Bound at Cal State San Bernardino is keeping students' dreams alive. Upward Bound currently hosts 100 students, 50 from San Bernardino and 50 from Rialto. We provide participants with the necessary tools and skills needed to successfully graduate from high school and matriculate into institutions of higher

education and ultimately, in helping students with the attainment of their educational, career and life goals.

This past summer Upward Bound held our first six-week Summer University program. UB students participated in math, English and enrichment classes, which included: science, culture, college planning, and study skills. Every Friday, UB students went on field trips to experience hands on activities involving science, math, culture, career exploration, and to visit local college campuses. Students visited CSUSB, UCLA, USC, Body World (LA Science Center), Panhe (California Indian cultural site), and San Clemente beach.

Our first summer program was a complete success and we are continuing with the momentum into the school year. Upward Bound continues to provide direct services to our students which include: tutoring, academic advising, academic skills building workshops, Saturday University, scholarship, career and college exploration, and financial aid information.

Food Drive and Toys for Tots

The Foundation for California State University, San Bernardino hosted its first annual food drive in November to help feed the homeless during the upcoming holidays. With the support of everyone on campus, 350 pounds of food was collected making this food drive nothing short of a complete success! The food drive was in partnership with Mary's Mercy Center, Inc. located right here in San Bernardino (www.marysmercycenter.org). Marsha Olguin, Director of Mary's Table, a division that provides hot nutritious meals six days per week to the needy, stated that the number of people they are feeding has increased from approximately 200 people per day to now more than 350 people per day since October 1st!
